The Rockgarden of Love was accepted by Karl Young for Light and Dust online, 1999. Underlining was turned off on my machine, and I never knew until my last several works that I could include a line of html that would turn off underlining for the viewer. But you probably remember that. I considered the practice related to print. With html, you could color code the link. The work includes frames, sound applets, animation, Dreamweaver timelines, a little java. Just a web-specific love poem.

## IMPT.

As you'll quickly see, some things no longer work. The beginning had a title that moved into place. I was using Dreamweaver. Luckily the few sound files can likely be converted to something that works. Oh, my goodness, I forgot about the drag and drop. The automatic scroll still works. Most of the images haven't deteriorated too much.

This image below is simply a screen grab I cobbled together. I might have put this up when the Dreamweaver dynamic html stopped migrating. In the file folder, you can see the begin-here table of contents does link. On "goggles," a dissonant favorite, the animation is composed of layers. 


